MUMC COUNCIL MEETING

May 12, 2004

Meeting called to order by Sharon Hutchinson at 7:09 p.m.

Minutes were approved.

Denice led us in prayer after joys and concerns were shared.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Financial/Treasurer's Report

DianeZastovnik explained all bills are paid and it took all the money in the checking account. Over \$2,000 was pledged in the **second mile giving campaign**. Of the unspecified funds amounting to \$1,745.00 three options were offered. Council voted in favor of the first option, which was to pay toward the phone bill, postage and office expenses. The Hmong Associate Salary is covered for the year. **Trustee's Report**

Dee Carr reported only three visitors will be allowed to be on the agenda at each meeting and they must request to be on the agenda by calling Betty Gist or Mac Magargee the Sunday before the Wednesday meeting. **Memorial Trees:** The congregation will be requested to name any trees that were planted in memory of loved ones. If they need to be removed, a replacement tree will be planted in a respectful manner. **Sign:** Mac Magargee is still

The building advisory committee met on April 27 and Tuesday, June 29 is the next meeting. They will ask the Trustees at the next Trustees meeting for information about what parts of our church buildings are subject to overuse and under use.

Special Committee to Survey Church Members for Missions "Heartbursts"

On Friday, June 11 at noon, Sharon Hutchinson and Diane Zastovnik will work on the wording of the all-church missions survey. George Elgin passed out an outline of the process of surveying congregation for their opinions on various subjects, and discussed system theory and survey methods.

Christian Education

On Saturday, May 15, 2004, the wood shavings will be added to the children's climbing structure and it will soon be complete. George Elgin reports there will be 10 graduates from the Disciple IV class.

Evangelism: No report.

Horizon Group: meets Tuesday, May 18 to discuss the mission and visions statement.

Youth: No report.

Staff Parish Relations: Surveys for staff performance will be going out at the end of May.

Missions Committee: Father's Day promotion will feature fund raising for tools.

Mission Thrift Shop: No monthly report was available but sales for last Saturday were \$169.

Worship: Worship Committee met Saturday, May 8. The bulletin is being reworked and fine-tuning the modifications. The committee reviewed worship for the year and appreciates Kate's tremendous music contributions.

Boutique: Boutique group requests "PLEASE DO NOT STACK CHAIRS AND TABLES IN FRONT OF THE CUPBOARDS". They refer to the cabinets on the south end of the social hall, left side of the doors.

NEW BUSINESS

Elections: Denise reported that the Nominations Committee nominated Carol Mohan, Agenda Chairman for Worship Committee replacing Kim Leslie; and Ron Zastovnik for audio Visual Subcommittee to Worship. Also, Eleanor Knudsen and Kayte Van DeMark are nominated to the fund raising committee. A motion was made and carried to elect the above persons.

Sharee Woxell presented an idea for a fund-raiser wherein \$1,000 is sent to a company to print \$10.00 advertising cards to be used as discount cards of which the church would keep \$6.00 of the \$10.00 collected for each card. After discussion a motion was made and carried requesting Sharee to investigate this opportunity further and to attain references from actual groups who have worked with this company.

Calendar of Events: May 20 is the Lifeline date for health screening here at MUMC.. At California-Nevada Annual Conference beginning June 16, 2004, volunteers will be needed to assist in the Oasis Center (information booth). May 15 from 9 to 12, Denise, the Grams and others will travel to Dinuba to meet with the Methodist Church there to share our preparation of disciple leadership experiences.

Red Cross has requested donations from our church on Memorial Day Weekend for victims of fires. By consensus, MUMC declines because of our efforts to support the UMCOR disaster relief projects.

Pastor's Comments: Denice reported a memorial gift from Georgia and Frances Sears estate of \$3,252. \$1,500 will go toward the sign and \$1,500 will go toward the playground wood shavings with \$252 remaining in the memorials account.


