## MUMC COUNCIL MEETING April 14, 2004

Meeting called to order by Sharon Hutchinson at 7:05 p.m.

Minutes were corrected to read: **Boutique group** submitted bylaws not "will be making bylaws"...

Minutes were approved as corrected.

#### Joys and Concerns

Before Joys and Concerns, Denice presented materials entitled Vision and Mission Statement; Reaffirmation of our two basic long-range goals as our priorities; Growing as a Disciple of Christ at Memorial UMC.

She recommended an **annual evaluation and reassessment of the vision and mission statement.** Motion made and carried to refer Vision and Mission Statement with Our Core Values to the Horizon team for review and report back with recommendation at the June Council meeting. Later in the meeting Connie Alfaro made the motion that was carried to approve the Horizon discipleship process for MUMC members.

After joys and concerns were shared, Denice lead us in prayer.

**Finance Report** \$20,314.00 received in the general fund. Apportionments of \$5,000 were paid. A total of \$1,500 will be paid for the alarm system. Approximately \$2,000 was pledged towards the **Second Mile Giving Campaign**. This is viewed as a success although more funds are required to meet our budget.

**Apportionment Payments** Discussed how to handle paying quarterly payments of apportionments if there is not enough money. **Motion made** and carried to pay as much as possible towards apportionments each quarter and not to deplete our funds beyond \$3,000.

**Trustee Report: Church security system** has been installed and paid for. The sensor had been knocked off the door in the social hall so trustees ask that rough housing and throwing balls in the social hall be curtailed. The **new sign** is being designed. It will include a lighted marquee readable from both sides and include information about MUMC services, Korean and Hmong services. It will cost about \$1,500, which does not include installation. A permit will be needed, electrical accommodations worked out and trustees will return to council with further details.

**Christian Education** The 6<sup>th</sup> graders are having Sunday evening meetings and Diane Zastovnik is in charge. This is an introduction to the youth group they will join in the seventh grade.

**Evangelism:** Welcome Ministry training sessions are set for May 2, May 16, and May 23, 2004 at 11:15 in room 4 New **Headsets** for hearing devices are ready. It is necessary to turn off hearing aid or take it out to use the headset.

Youth Report Connie Alfaro wants to put a plaque of recognition in the Eagle Scout gardening project for Ben Zastovnik. The watering system on the north side of the driveway needs repair and Connie will present to the trustees for approval

Church Building Advisory Committee Rick Hutchinson reported on the April 27 meeting. The committee decided that, to better understand the current use of the Church's facilities, they request the help of the Trustees to identify those portions of our buildings which are underutilized and those which, because of greater use, are bottlenecks to scheduling. To better understand future uses of our current buildings and to understand what facilities are needed for a new building, the committee suggests the creation of a special committee to complete the survey (first proposed at the November 12, 2003 Council meeting) of church members' needs and desires concerning their interests (their "heartbursts") in missional programs and services. The committee is to organize and complete the survey and report to the Council at the September meeting. **Staff Parish Relations** reports there will be a staff recognition dinner on June 13 at 5:30 funded by Staff Parish.

**Mission Thrift Shop** The Thrift Shop is "going good" and will now be open every Saturday.

Worship committee reports next meeting will be May 8.

**Oakhurst Hymnals:** Motion made and carried to raise funds for 10 hymnals and 10 Faith We Sing songbooks for the new United Methodist Church in Oakhurst. Funding will go through the district office for better buying power.

**Kham Dy** reported Hmong worship services are going well with the lowest attendance at 90 persons! 20 youth and 10 adults attended the first Hmong youth gathering in Sacramento. On May 30, there will be a welcoming of new members.

**Elections:** Motion made and carried that the following persons be elected to serve as indicated below: Kim Leslie, Worship "Team chair; Gloria McClanahan, Council Secretary; Lynette Jordan, SPRC representative to Finance and Joan Bowser member of the Renovation Committee.

**HIPA** requirements: Because we are a church, we are not subject to HIPA (Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act.

**Narthex Cleanup:** Joan Bowser who helped clean up the narthex, asked how it can be kept clean. Denice suggested approaching Worship Committee for support and perhaps they would refer it to the ushers.

**Permanent Endowment Fund** Rick Hutchinson reported that the Permanent Endowment committee discussed creating sub-accounts for the Permanent Endowment Fund wherein a missional group can solicit permanent endowment funds for their particular purpose. **Motion made and carried** that Church Council approves the solicitation of funds by any church missional group for the Permanent Endowment Fund. Such funds would become sub-accounts of the current Permanent Endowment Fund and be subject to all rules and regulations of the Fund.

**Pastor's Comments:** On the 24<sup>th</sup> of April , Denice, Barbara and Roger Grams will travel to the Dinuba Methodist church and explain changes we are experiencing through development of disciples, mission statement creation, and our Horizon Team functions.
