# DID YOU KNOW? OUR COFFEE HOUR IS "FAIR TRADE"

Did you know that our fellowship time after worship features Fair Trade coffee and tea? Coffee is the second largest U.S. import after oil and we are the largest consumer of the beverage in the world. Few Americans know that many small coffee farmers are paid an amount for the beans they toil so hard to grow that is less than the cost of production. Many of these farmers are forced into a cycle of poverty and debt.

For a coffee or tea importer to become Fair Trade certified, they must meet certain criteria. These include agreeing to pay a fair minimum price to the grower for beans or leaves, encouraging and helping to provide healthy and safe working conditions for laborers, assuring that child labor laws are not being abused, buying from producers who engage in environmentally sustainable practices, etc. By purchasing Fair Trade Certified products, we show our support for an equitable partnership between marketers in North America and growers in Latin America, Asia, Africa, and the Caribbean.

#### **CROP WALK 2004**

Did you know the 2004 CROP walk for the Hungry will begin and end right here at good old Clovis Memorial UMC? Not only do we have the opportunity to get out our walking shoes to raise money and raise awareness about the tragedy of hunger-we also get to host the event!! The date is Sunday, October 24<sup>th</sup> with registration and entertainment starting around 2 pm. The Walk will begin at 2:30 pm and take walkers on a 3-mile route through downtown Clovis, on the Sugar Pine Trail and back to the church. Our church has been participating in this event for over 20 years.

CROP Walks are held all over the United States to bring attention to the issue of global and national hunger and its related consequences. A portion of the money raised goes to Church World Service, an interfaith organization that works in partnership with others like Heifer Project to provide sustainable self-help and development to people in need around the globe, disaster relief wherever and whenever it is needed and refugee assistance. You may find out more about CWS by logging on to their www.churchworldservice.org. website at Another portion goes to agencies selected by the local Walk's organizing committee who are involved in feeding the hungry of our local This year's recipients are the communities. Community Food Bank and FIRM (Fresno Interdenominational Refugee Ministries). Our Community Garden, a project begun with the support and guidance of FIRM, will be open for our guests to see on the day of the Walk.

I hope many of you will walk or sponsor a walker. If you can't walk, consider coming out to be a CUMC "greeter," extending a warm welcome to the wonderfully diverse group-Christians, Jews, Muslims, Buddhists, men, women, young, old, physically challenged -- who come together to help the hungry. Maybe you'd like to bake cookies for the walkers to enjoy at the end of the walk or help at registration tables. This would be appreciated
