GROWING OUR SPIRITUAL FAMILY

BUILDING USE COORDINATOR NAMED

After years of serving as our wedding hostess, keeping an eye on the thermostats, and handling requests for use of the Fellowship Hall, Diane Zastovnik is now our official Building Use Coordinator. She is responsible to schedule outside groups, help them understand the Board of Trustees building use policies and fee schedule and to be sure these policies are followed. If you are associated with a group outside the church that would like to use the facilities, your group will fill out a building use request and see Diane. Diane will act as liaison between your outside group and any other groups using the space you request and connect you with anyone else who needs to be consulted. Remember, church groups reserve space by simply filling out a Calendar Date and Room Request slip and giving it to the church secretary.

T-QUEST GROUP FOR MEN STARTED

The opening meeting of T-Quest for Men was held at 7:00 p. m on Monday, January 13th in the Lose Library. T-Quest is a brand new weekly Bible Study and Support Group for men and will run for 40 weeks.

T-Quest is a ministry of the United Methodist Commission on Men, with its own published curriculum. The UMCM hopes to start at least one group in each of our denomination's 510 districts within the next five years. To the best of our knowledge Clovis MUMC is the first congregation in Fresno District to initiate a group.

T-Quest consists of Bible Study, prayer support, sharing, mutual accountability, and journaling. Each week's meeting will be about 90 minutes long and requires 30-45 minutes of preparation at home.

A second group will be started when at least four men sign up for it. If interested, please contact Parel Mathai.



We will use "The Way of Forgiveness," a six-week study. UMW circles and UMM are invited to form groups and use this study as well. There will be daytime as well as evening groups. Be sure to note what time is best for you.

If you are just beginning to practice God's presence on a daily basis, begin with just one thing like prayer. They say it takes 21 days to make a new habit so give yourself grace and go for it!
