### "FAT TUESDAY" ASH SERVICE

Join us Sunday evening at 5:30 pm in the Fellowship Hall for our annual Fat Tuesday supper followed by an Ash Service to mark the beginning of Lent. The meal is a feast of "fat things" including eggs, sausage, and potatoes brought to us by cooks Roger and Barbara Grams and faithful crew. There will be a donation for the meal. Childcare will be provided.

The Ash Service is a traditional Christian observance. Things in our lives we need to confess or give up: grudges, hurts, unrealistic notions, things we need to forgive others or ourselves for etc. are written on slips of paper and burned with last Palm Sunday's palm leaves. The fire kindled in darkness gives us time to reflect on making a new beginning. The resulting ash is mixed with oil and dabbed on the forehead or hand in the sign of the cross with the words, "Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return," or "Repent and believe the good news." This is to remind us we are creatures with limitations and not God.

Everyone is also invited to participate in a Lenten Observance such as prayer, fasting or "giving up" something for the season of Lent to help remind us of our dependence upon God and help us to seek God's will and presence in our lives.

Lent is a forty-day period of preparation prior to Holy Week and Easter in which we follow Jesus to the cross and reflect on what it means to be his disciples and what God is doing in his ministry, death and resurrection.

#### **CENTER FOR SPIRITUAL CARE**

For some 15 years the Center for Spiritual Care at Saint Agnes Medical Center has offered our Spiritual Care volunteers an educational opportunity to gain the skills needed for lay ministry. The individual could volunteer in the congregation or here at Saint Agnes or any of the local hospitals.

The revised 17-hour program is offered over 3 Saturdays. Foundations in Health Ministry and Pastoral Care is scheduled for March 6, March 20, and April 3, 2004

The course will cover the following topics: History and Theology of Pastoral and Health Ministry; Spirituality and Spiritual Well-being; Caring Throughout the Life Span; Wholeness and Well-being: the Mind Body Spirit Connection; Transitions: Talking It Over; Living with Grief and Loss; Values and Cultural Sensitivity; A Healthy Community: the Faith Community's Role; Promoting Wholeness and Well-being within the Congregation; Making a Pastoral Visit; The Role of Prayer and Ritual; Eucharist Ministry in the Hospital and Congregation.




# THE 30-HOUR FAMINE IS COMING! THE 30-HOUR FAMINE IS COMING!
