Thanks to the graciousness of our church family, our youth are lucky enough to have their own place to hang out. Called "The Bungalow," the building sits right in the middle of the church property, and was converted from a house into a meeting place for the youth group. We have our own kitchen and bathroom areas, and a room full of comfortable furniture.

Through the hard work of our previous youth pastor, Kindra Snow, church family members, and the youth themselves, the Bungalow recently got new carpet, ceiling fans, swamp cooler, and a new paint job. But there's a few things left to do to make it more functional for both the youth and other church members who may wish to use the space. Here is a short list:

- Install vinyl flooring in the kitchen and bathroom
- Bring the bathroom facility into working order
- Connect the swamp cooler to appropriate water and electrical supplies
- Repair the kitchen cupboards and shelves
- Paint the kitchen and bathroom

To raise the estimated \$1,200.00 needed to complete this project, the youth group will hold two special events in the month of June: a bake sale on June 8 and a Summer Kick-off Barbecue on June 29. More details will follow in upcoming church announcements.

In the early evening (5:30 – 7:30 p.m.) there will be a BBQ dinner in Fellowship Hall sponsored by our Endowment Committee.

Have you ever wondered what the life of a Methodist circuit rider was like? A circuit rider will visit us that evening thanks to our own Rev. Newell Knudson! We will also salute our hard working church staff. Our youth will serve and Barbara and Roger Grams and crew will cook. Yum! Tickets will be on sale shortly and proceeds will benefit our youth.

I am very excited by the progress we are making with our Hmong Ministry Outreach. With the addition of pastor Kham Dy Yang to our staff as Hmong Equipping Pastor we have outstanding leadership and experience at the helm of this ministry. Seeds are being planted and beginning to sprout. Please pray for a good harvest! We are very gradually gathering Hmong leadership and there is a lot of interest being generated in the Clovis Hmong ministry in the Hmong community.

We recently received the happy news that we have received a small grant for our Hmong Ministry. The Patton fund, administered by our Conference Board of Missions has awarded us 4,000 for professional expense reimbursement for pastor Kham Dy Yang for the year 2003. We recently submitted a grant to the Board of Global Ministries requesting over one hundred thousand dollars. Kham Dy is working to incorporate the service portion of the ministry into a 501c3 non-profit so we may pursue other funding as well.

Finally I have sad news: Our very talented Music Director Scott Hatfield is

stepping down as choir director. Scott has served since 1998. Now that he is teaching full time and his children are growing up he needs more family time. Scott will remain on staff as our praise music pianist and for this we are so grateful. The Worship and Staff Parish Committees are hard at work looking for a replacement Choir Director. We will have an opportunity to honor Scott for his work. In the meantime God is good and has called us all to a really wonderfully satisfying ministry here at Memorial. I am happy to be returning as your pastor for another year and feel very blessed!
