PASTOR DENICE ADDRESSES UMM FELLOWSHIP MEETING

Pastor Denice Leslie was the special speaker for the United Methodist Men's breakfast fellowship meeting on Saturday, February 1. She spoke about practicing spiritual disciplines, especially nurturing areas of spirituality one is weakest, and provided plenty of written materials to chew on in the days to come. She encouraged the men present to start regular Bible study, personal prayer life, and covenant groups, like the T-Quest. UMM is grateful to Pastor Denice for her valuable instruction at this time as we are about to enter the season of Lent.

UMM meeting approved a recommendation from the Executive Committee to fund mission projects in the church's 2003 budget, up to a maximum amount of \$500.00. The projects to be funded will be determined later.

Funding mission projects is in addition to "in-kind donations" United Methodist Men contributes every year. During 2002, UMM paid for various facility needs at our church, like repair of appliances, cutting off tree branches, etc—for a total of \$1382.20. The primary source of UMM funds is the proceeds from recycling donated newspapers, cans, etc. We are grateful to Max Cannon and his associates who haul these discards to recycling center month after month, converting them to cash to be used for kingdom purposes, while promoting recycling to tend to God's creation.

Men's breakfast fellowship meetings are held, unless otherwise announced, in the Social Hall at 8:00AM on the first Saturday of the month. A home cooked breakfast with all-you-can-drink coffee is served for \$3.00. It is a great time to get to know fellow church members and be encouraged and strengthened in your Christian walk. MARGARETE HUDSON STATUES GRACE PRAYER GARDENS

Have you noticed the lovely Margaret Hudson statues nestled into the sanctuary prayer gardens? They have been given in loving memory of Nellie Wamsley through the memorial gifts of her friends and family. We thank Donna Wamsley and the family for such thoughtful contributions to our prayer gardens.

DONATIONS-IN-KIND

In addition to the generous cash contributions that our members gave in 2002, we were blessed with numerous donations-in-kind which helped keep our church facility and programs running. The United Methodist Men trimmed \$900 from landscaping costs for the church by paying for tree pruning services. The men's group and individual members also provided over \$650 in building maintenance. Members contributed over \$760 toward items to beautify our worship services, keep our thrift store functioning efficiently and provide supplies and staples for our kitchen. The library, evangelism, finance, Growing Our Spiritual Family, music, Sunday school, office equipment, Micah ministries, congregational care, and United Methodist Men also benefited from items donated by caring individuals. The total recorded donation of in-kind items exceeds \$3,100, but there are countless other donations from those given to the thrift store and the boutique through coffee hour goodies through computers and even pens for the office which help our church carry out its mission.

To all fellow members of the Clovis United Methodist Church,

My name is Mariamma K. Mathai. For the last two years I have been worshipping with you. My family and I were transferred from St. Luke United Methodist Church of Fresno. I have become a Church Council member for the year 2003 and I just had the orientation with other members of the council on January 8, 2003. I am a member-at-large, representing all the members of the church. The purpose of this letter is to request your prayers for me and for all the elected leaders of our church. Below is a suggestion to follow:

Personal Needs

Humility: Ask God to give your leaders true humility, which includes having a servant's heart, being teachable, admitting wrongdoing, being willing to receive positive criticism, and reliance in God.

Wisdom to know God's Agenda: Pray that your leaders remain sensitive to God's leading, and that we will live and work according to God's priorities.

Positive Relationships: Ask God to help your leaders be patient with themselves and others, to interact positively with difficult people in the congregation, and to treat everyone with love and respect.

Spirit-filled Life: Pray that your leaders will have love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.

Family Needs: The demands of ministry can take a toll on the family life. Pray that your leaders would make family his/her top God given priority.

Provision for the families' needs: Ask God that they will be blessed with good health and material resources so that joyfully they can serve the Lord.

Spiritual Needs: Time alone with God: To be anointed by the power of the Holy Spirit, the leaders need to spend time with God by praying and studying Scripture. Pray that your leaders will put on the full armor of God, as listed in Ephesians 6:10-18, and that they will be given protection from the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the price of life (1 John 2:16).

Congregational Needs: Especially for the Pastor. Pray that your pastor will have a heart for the lost and that she will make evangelism a priority. Pray that your pastor will continue to grow in her spiritual life so that she can equip the congregation to grow and develop into a mature Christian life.

Let me hear from you about your concerns and prayer needs. I look forward to serving you.

TWO ASH SERVICES THIS YEAR

If you are unable to attend the Ash Service at 6:30 p.m. on Sunday evening March 2 following our annual Fat Tuesday Breakfast Dinner at 5:00 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall, you may attend a second service scheduled for Tuesday, February 4th at the Healing Service at 7:00 p.m. in the Sanctuary.

The imposition of ashes is a symbolic action that reminds us of our creatureliness and human limitations as we begin our journey with Jesus to the cross and beyond to the empty tomb this Lent/Easter Season. You are invited to consider practicing a Lenten Discipline such as service, fasting, forgoing something you are fond of for the purpose of drawing one's attention to our dependence and need for God in our lives. The ashes are made from the burning of the previous year's palms and those burdens we wish to lay aside written on small pieces of paper and burned during the service.

HOW WE COMMUNICATE WHAT WE BELIEVE THROUGH OUR SANCTUARY FURNITURE

Did you ever think about how we witness to our faith through the physical things we put in our worship space? When we come into worship our space should witness to three things: God's word in scripture, the sacrament of baptism and the sacrament of communion. How do we make this witness? By appropriately using each item of furniture designed for its special witness.

First, the baptismal font should always be up where we can see it and not left off the platform or pushed way back by the choir rail. Second, the communion table should either be

used every Sunday for communion OR it should bear the emblems of the Lord's Supper: a chalice and plate or pitcher, chalice and plate. The candles may be on the communion table as well or free standing on either side or placed on a table behind the communion table along with the flowers for the day. It is always appropriate to have real flowers or plants near the cross or down in front of the communion table.

Third, the bible should always be on the lectern where it is <u>read</u> every Sunday, not sitting on the communion table or any other table off to the side. We have a special bible in this congregation that is no longer read in worship as we have a newer translation we use. This bible has sat open for many years on the communion table in a place of honor. Rather than place it on the lectern where it will be worn from being used inappropriately as a stand for the current bible, it is most appropriate to place this historical bible open and elevated on the table behind the communion table along with the flowers.

Until recently we haven't had a table behind the communion table for this purpose. Having the new table means that even on Communion Sundays we can (and should) have flowers as well as the open bible in place although flowers may always be appropriately placed on the floor in front of the communion

table. Unfortunately, the new table is about 10 inches short and needs to be elevated so the flowers and the bible may be seen at a height above the communion table. The renovation committee is working on an appropriate way to raise the new table. We hope to have this work completed before Easter in April. Any one wishing more information may be interested in reading the book United Methodist Altars. Leave word at the office if you would like to borrow it. Changes in our worship space use of furniture is one of a number of changes that have come to us along with our new services for communion and baptism; and seasonal services such as Ash Wednesday over the last 20 years as we are benefiting from liturgical renewal and research into how the early church worshiped and why.

LENTEN STUDY GROUPS AND LENTEN DEVOTIONAL: THE WAY OF FORIVENESS

Small groups begin meeting this month for an 8 week study of the Christian practice of forgiveness. Small group leaders are Lynette Jordan, Mariamma Mathai, Nancy Enloe and Denice Leslie. Also, George Elgin is leading a study on the healing ministry of the church called "Blessed to be a Blessing." If you have not had an opportunity to register for a group call the office as soon as possible so we may place you.

Also, we have available this year the annual Lenten Calendar of Devotions for 2004 in both the small pocket size and in the large print. Pick one up Sunday March 2 in the lobby of the church. It is formatted like the Upper Room devotional. A .65 donation is requested by not required. We prefer every devotional find its way into someone's life—so pick up to give to someone else.


