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**LEADER ORIENTATION 2009 –AST TEAMS AND LEADER NETWORK JAN. 25:** Every team leader will receive a packet the Administrative Support Team developed last year of basic, need to know administrative assistance and Finance and Facilities information to help you and facilitate your work. We will do Leader Orientation of the AST Teams in their individual meetings. All other leaders will receive their packet and orientation at the January Network meeting which will be Sunday, January 25 after the 11 a.m. service in the Lose Library.

**TREES & CHEESE QUILT RAFFLE TO START JAN. 4:** Our Sunday School children's mission tradition has been to raise money to buy gift animals through Heifer International; each September there is a great debate about which animal we will buy. This year, we have set our sights very high with the special \$1,000.00 Milk Menagerie gift (four milk-producing animals: one quality breed heifer, two goats, and one water buffalo). If we raise more than \$1,000.00, we will purchase trees, which are planted for firewood and to prevent erosion. Which is why this year our project is called "Trees and Cheese!" A beautiful hand-crafted quilt has been donated to the Sunday School, to be raffled off and the proceeds to benefit "Trees and Cheese." Tickets go on sale Sunday January 4 through Sunday February 15, from any Sunday School teacher or child. The quilt will be available for viewing during coffee hour every Sunday. **HUMAN RELATIONS DAY SUNDAY JANUARY 18:** Human Relations Day furthers the development of better human relations, calling the Church to recognize the right of all God's children in realizing their potential as human beings in relationship with each other. Offering receipts go 57% to the Community Developers Program and 33% to the United Methodist Voluntary Services Program (both through General Board of Global Ministries), and 10% to the Youth Offender Rehabilitation Program (through General Board of Church and Society).

**UMM BREAKFAST MEETING January 3, 2008:** Breakfast will be prepared by Howard Cook although there seems to have been a good response to Jon's preparations at the last breakfast. ## MINISTRY SPOTLIGHT

### **FOUR BASIC MINISTRY TEAMS PROVIDE BACKBONE OF DISCIPLING AT MUMC:**

The following four basic team provide a system for fulfilling our vision of *Empowering Servant Leadership*, and aligning our ministries with our mission of *Showing and Telling Jesus' Love Everywhere*. These Basic Ministry System Teams are: The Administrative Support Team: responsible for finance and facilities policies and procedures. The AST has a cluster of work teams that relate to it: Facilities Maintenance, Staff Parish Relations, Finance Work Team, Fundraising, Renovation, Counters, Office Finance Team, Prayer Gardens, Memorials and Gifts, Endowment. It meets the fourth Tuesday of the month at 4:30 p.m. in the Lose Library. The AST includes the Trustees who are the legal officers of the corporation. Leader Network: The Leader Network is a quarterly meeting on a Sunday after the second worship hour in the Lose Library and is composed of all the team leaders of every ministry and mission group in the congregation. It meets for support, connecting new comers to mission and ministry, calendaring and coordinating and delegating the planning of church wide activities. It also acts as a two-way communication vehicle between teams and leadership on issues affecting the whole body of the church. There are currently over forty different ministries at MUMC. Spiritual Leaders: The Spiritual Leaders Circle meets monthly after the late service on the first Sunday of the month in the Lose Library. The Spiritual Leaders provide spiritual direction for the congregation. They provide direction for the course of our ministry via a Horizon Line report to Charge Conference annually. They support existing ministries and as keepers of the vision, mission and core values are responsible for aligning new ministries with our vision, mission and core values as we seek God's will and guidance in all of our endeavors. They are responsible for leader's growth in discipleship as well as for assessing the health and vitality of the congregation and making recommendations. The Equipping Team is responsible for equipping lay

leadership through the matching of individual gifts and call to ministry. It also manages the five stage Spirit Quest Discipleship process of classes designed to mature disciples and provide a Ministry Gifts Discovery Process. It annually fills vacancies for those offices required by the Discipline and prepares the Lay Leadership Report.

**LESLIE'S SALT SHAKER:** It's hard to start the New Year without celebrating the accomplishments of the year past! This church is not a place that is busy just to be busy—the majority of the active congregation is involved in growing and serving as disciples. So here is a brief review of what that looked like in 2008: First of all, I want to congratulate everyone who made the retiring of the indebtedness on the Social Hall possible! We had a great celebration appreciating those saints who made the building a reality through

perseverance and faithfulness and stewardship. This past year has seen the beginning of a new service with an aim of reaching out to a younger generation. Your gracious adjustment to a new service and fellowship schedule and your acceptance and encouragement for the *Imagine!* service has been heartening. We are in the process of ensuring the quality of the service by developing a list of back up musicians as we look toward taking the service "public" and advertising our presence as we also seek to reach out to families with children. The attendance has been remarkably good the first three months and the overall attendance on Sunday morning for both services has increased a bit. That is also encouraging. We're doing it! It's wonderful! We have numerous ministries faithfully plugging along doing what they do best: Mission Thrift not only provided a great place for the low income folks of our community to shop as well as us, but also contributed more this year to our connectional mission giving than the previous year. Boutique Crafters Christmas Boutique also provided more for our missions this year than ever before providing for Carol Partridge, UM Missionary in Macedonia as well as for our apportionments. Parish Nursing really took off in 2008 adding to the annual Healthy Heart Potluck classes in CPR and an introduction to the use of defibrillators which led to donations for the purchase of two defibrillators with training for eight. And, interest in going "Green" with the possibility of solar for our facilities has resulted in the formation of a new Green Team. Spiritual Leaders completed their first year creating a framework for mission alignment conversations with our ministry teams, with those conversations to begin in this New Year. They also took on the Prayer Cell project and are initiating prayer cells which continues into this year. They also perfected a Leader Covenant to encourage faithful discipleship and leadership which they all signed and will introduce to leaders during the ministry conversations. And they made their first report to the Charge Conference for the Horizon Line for 2009: a list of goals including the continuing effort to act on federating our three congregations for the purpose of mission and ministry by building community. The Longest Night service with Fresno Korean UMC and the Christmas Pageant with CHRIST Ministry were both well received. Micah Ministries created a round table of different mission teams for coordination of our efforts: Food Pantry, Community Garden, Homeless, Warm Tree, Brown Bag, Mission Thrift Shop, Sierra Villa Rest home, Empty Bowls, Interfaith Alliance, Hmong Ministry, and others interested in mission. We plan to add Boutique Crafter representatives this year and have added a new team of folks interested in Social Concerns (church and society). CHRIST Ministry has grown remarkably in reaching its 1.5 generation target population and has had a stable year with increased stewardship, out-

reach and leadership development. Your support through the provision of facilities and open arms is making this ministry possible. Adult education has been particularly enriching as George Elgin has offered a variety of classes this year including one on Comparative Religions and Lucy Elgin has an ongoing class on the Four L's of Parenting—Laughter was the most recent topic. Meanwhile our Youth Group has grown and decided to take on the challenge of the Amazing Bible Race, a two year commitment to read through the bible. After the introduction of Vital Signs by our district superintendent, Mariellen Yoshino we had forty copies out in the congregation and a great turn out to do the Vital Signs assessment last Spring through the Leader Network. We look forward to having a consultation on how to continue to build vitality. Equipping Ministries fulfilled a long held goal of hiring a part time Equipper in our church secretary Sara Glazebrook who is doing the data base and gifts discovery process work we need to help disciples find their call and place in God's service. We continue to work on the Spirit Quest process with the hope of funneling more folks into each of the five stages of maturing disciples. Many fellowship and ministries of Christian Care giving go on all year long. These include the Prayer Chain, Special Friends care of our convalescing and shut-in, Parish Callers who extend our care to the hospitalized while Care Cluster callers keep in touch with everyone serving not only to keep folks connected but to get the word out about various activities. The Thursday Night Diners provides weekly potluck fellowship with good humor and care for each person who attends. All know they are loved and cared about. Worship Ministries expanded this year to include the *Imagine!* service team which meets weekly for evaluation and planning of the new service and for bible study of the lections that will be proclaimed in preaching. The Worship Plan Team has continued to faithfully plan for the overall worship needs of the congregation and this year saw the fruition of our efforts to expand our visual technology and the use of visual presentation every Sunday. Hats off to Ron Zastovnik who has shouldered this ministry and for building a team of great sound and presentation techs. Wayne Golden on sound has been so faithful for both services week in and week out. As has Gary Gentry on Presentation. We hope to keep building this team. The Fundraising Team's Pepsi Booth sales increased our visibility in the Clovis Community as did the Yard Sale which benefited our Mission Thrift ministry. All in all this is a very faithful church. We need to keep ourselves aware of those we seek to serve who are outside the walls of our church and invite them to know the life saving and transforming love of Jesus Christ through growth and service to others.
