
Our December Second Sunday Lunch is on December 9th and for January it will be on the 13th.

This training will happen in early February 2019.




Christian Book Club

Finance Report

Finance Report as of October 31 General Fund

September Balance: -\$5,392
October Income: \$17,350
October Expenses: \$17,454
October Balance: -\$5,496

As of the end of October we have paid out more this year in our General Fund than we have brought in. The extra expenses have been covered by borrowing from some of the designated funds. If we receive more generous donations in November and December, we can reimburse those funds.

We will also need to complete our Conference tithe (apportionments). The Church Council contributed some of its Discretionary Funds from Second Sunday Lunches and other small special income items to complete the June tithe. The Thrift Store and the Boutique may cover most of the July through October tithes. This means the General Fund will have to cover at least two more months. If all those who are behind in their Estimates of Giving could catch up, we would have an additional \$9,800 which would just about cover the budget deficit and the two months of Conference tithe. It will also be a great help if those who have not given the Extra Mile can give an extra \$25 or more each month during the remainder of the year. As a church, we have many wonderful ministries that we are able to carry out, and many more that we carry in our hearts until we find a way to make them happen. We pray that each person associated with our church will find ways to help further God's kingdom.



We are moving into a season of high-volume ministry. In the coming weeks we will have more than double the amount of ministry activities as we do on a regular basis during the other eleven months of the year. It **COULD** be a time of simple exhaustion. It **COULD** result in short tempers and much complaining. It **COULD** cause people to withdraw from one another, to isolate, to disconnect from relationships and endless "to-dos."

OR

It **COULD** point us to see places where we depend on our own strength, rather than allowing the power of God to fill and use us. It **COULD** help us draw closer as we work with the people we just met to faithfully share the gospel with those who are walking in spiritual darkness. It **COULD** give us unique opportunities to wipe away any facade our self-righteousness may have erected, and kneel again before the refugee baby who brings us salvation. The choice is ours.

Will we receive the gift of hope?

Will we share it with others?

It is easy to get lost in the craziness that our modern holiday celebrations can bring. It is **ESSENTIAL**, therefore, to spend time daily keeping connected to the source of true peace and joy, so that these holidays are truly holy-days for families and our community.

Because, after passing through the activities of December, we remember that the real work of Christmas starts to unfold. This poem by Howard Thurman (1899 – April 10, 1981) tells us simply and beautifully what our ministries need to be in 2019:

When the song of the angels is stilled,

When the star in the sky is gone,

When the kings and princes are home,

When the shepherds are back with their flock,

The work of Christmas begins:

To find the lost,

To heal the broken,

To feed the hungry,

To release the prisoner,

To rebuild the nations,

To bring peace among people,

To make music in the heart.




