Small cans of fruit with pop tops



## **Finance Report**

# It's time for a happy dance to celebrate our February Finance Report.

In four of the five past years, we ended February in the red. Last year, we had a deficit of over \$20,000 in February. This year our General Fund had a balance of \$1,210. We do still owe around \$3,000 for the apportionment tithe for January and February, but we are hoping to receive about that much from the Thrift Store so we can catch up. We ended January this year with a deficit of \$4,734. February General Fund income was \$22,168 and General

While we are thrilled to be in the black at the end of February, we have more large bills coming up. The \$2,159 Workers Compensation premium is one of the big bills for March. We will have to make a health insurance payment in early April. It will probably be about \$7,128 to cover

Fund bills for the month totaled \$16,224.

about 4 ½ months.

These large bills mean that if we are not to fall into deficit again, we will need everyone to keep up with their giving.

One reason we were able to make it through February in the black was that several contributors are ahead on their estimates of giving. We will need help from those who are behind by a total of about \$3,500 to bring in the extra funds we need in these coming months.

Our General Fund budget planned for 2019 estimates an income of \$253,550 and expenditures of \$254,758. With this deficit of \$1,208 and an income shortfall of \$1,368 compared to the budget estimate at the end of February, we do need everyone's continuing devotion to help the church pay its bills and fund its ministries.

## **Special Called General Conference**

Report on the Special Called General Conference

In 1972 the General Conference added language to the United Methodist Church's <u>Book of Discipline</u> which set apart "practicing homosexuals" as people whose lifestyle is not in line with "Christian teaching" and limited the involvement LGBTQ+ people can have within the denomination. Since that time, the denomination has experienced strong tension between those who like that distinction, and those who find the *distinction* is not in line with Christian teaching. In 2016 the Council of Bishops was asked to guide the denomination to a path that would help the denomination find resolution and healing from the struggle. The Council of Bishops developed a "Commission on a Way Forward" to help find a way to meet that request.

The Commission on a Way Forward met for two years, traveling to every part of our United Methodist connection, listening to people of differing backgrounds, including: theological, cultural, ethnic, socioeconomic, and linguistic. From what was heard at its "listening sessions," the Commission developed the "One Church Plan" and two alternate plans, which were then presented to the Council of Bishops.

The One Church Plan, endorsed by the Council of Bishops, would allow but not require United Methodist clergy to perform same-gender weddings where legal, and allow but not require annual conferences to ordain LGBTQ pastors. "The One Church Plan is built on the belief that it is possible to live with more space while we focus on our common mission," the report states.

<u>The Connectional Conference Plan</u> would create "three values-based connectional conferences" in the U.S., and provide for central conferences to align with one of those connectional conferences or become one of their own. According to the report, the "Connectional Conference Plan addresses the reality of the UMC as it is now."

<u>The "Traditional Plan"</u> was developed by a few members of the Commission, rather than the full group. It would continue to exclude from many ministry and leadership opportunities people who are "practicing homosexuals". It also adds significant punishments for ordained clergy who, for example officiate at a same-gender wedding. The punishment requires suspension without pay for a minimum of one year for a first infraction, and a second infraction requires a loss of clergy credentials.

The Special Called General Conference met in St. Louis in February. The end result was, the delegates did not follow the Council of Bishop's recommendation, and voted 53% for the Traditional Plan, and 47% for the One Church Plan. The Connectional Conference Plan did not receive enough support to be considered by the full body. A "Gracious Exit" plan was also passed by the body.

As soon as the vote results were announced favoring the Traditional Plan, strong dissention began to be voiced, and continues to expand. Truthfully, dissention would have begun if the One Church Plan had passed. The hope of finding a resolution that would hold the denomination together and bring healing has not yet been fulfilled.

What is next?

We continue to pray for the denomination, and for each us, as we seek to listen for Jesus' voice to guide us on how best to be the body of Christ in our world today.

- 2) The Judicial Council of the UMC has been asked to rule on whether or not the provisions of the Traditional Plan and the Gracious Exit plan are in keeping with the constitution of the United Methodist Church. In a preliminary ruling made last October, the Judicial Council had ruled that much of the Traditional Plan was not constitutional. Now that the General Conference has adopted that Plan with some amendments, the Council will review the legislation and make an official ruling. The next Judicial Council meeting will be April 23-25, 2019.
- 3) Bishop Carcaño is traveling throughout our Annual Conference to talk with people and answer questions about this General Conference decision, and the ramifications for our Annual Conference and local congregations. In April the closest gathering to our location will be on **April 24**: 6:30 p.m. 9:00 p.m. at Tulare UMC

There has been a lot of information in the news lately about the Special General Conference that occurred in February. It made the "nightly news" all across the US. Many of us had been lifting the denomination in prayer as we headed into that special session. Now that it is over, it is clear we need to continue to hold the denomination in prayer!

Our Lenten worship services (in the English Language Ministry) are exploring the "Gifts of the Dark Wood." The starting place for appreciating these gifts which are found uniquely in the challenging places of life, is to embrace the "gift of uncertainty."

What a TREASURE it is to become comfortable in not knowing all the answers! Instead of stressing about "what ifs," we are free to wholeheartedly "go where Jesus leads" to "fully lean on Jesus," and above all to "go with God." When we embrace uncertainty, these common phrases take on new and deeper meaning.

The week before the General Conference began, I was asking God about the outcome. God let me know that no matter what decisions would be made, the work of the church needs to continue. There are still people who are hungering to meet Jesus. There are still so many people feeling lost and alone. There are people who don't know they are loved. And because of these realities, there is so much suffering caused by hurting and broken humans.

We have MUCH work to do! We have SO MUCH ministry to do, so much love to share in the name of Jesus! No matter what decisions are made, or how the denomination may change, God has told me we are to focus on the ministries that present themselves to us, and to stay focused on "making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world."

To do those things, we don't need "certainty" in anything other than this: God loves us. God wants the best for our lives. God does not abandon us. and Everywhere we go, God is already there.

May we each be blessed with the growing ability to embrace uncertainty, so that we may more and more embody our faith in Jesus.
