## The United Methodist School System in Liberia

Even before Liberia was a republic in 1847, the Methodist Church established its first school in Liberia, what is today College of West Africa (10<sup>th</sup> -12<sup>th</sup> grade). The United Methodist Church continued to build schools and educate children in all 15 counties of Liberia and today, the Liberia Annual Conference operates 56 schools throughout the nation, and a school in Guinea. More than 17,000 students are enrolled in these schools.

In 2018 the two high school senior students with the best performance on the National Exam in Liberia were from the J. J. Roberts United Methodist School in Monrovia. The best performing senior student on the exam in Guinea was from the Diecke United Methodist School. These three students are currently studying in Morocco on government scholarships.

While we are making progress in renovating and building schools after 14 years of civil war, there are still many challenges. West African text books in line with the National Curriculum are now available for purchase, but most of our students cannot afford them. Qualified, competent teachers are needed in all schools to present lessons, answer students' questions, and spark interest in learning. During the current 2018/2019 school year, 5 out of 27 of our United Methodist High Schools have functioning

science labs. Well-equipped learning environments would provide opportunities for students to engage in science experiments and discovery through reading books and using computer programs.

The five-year strategic plan of the Liberia Annual Conference (2019-2023) identifies the priority areas to improve teaching and learning in the United Methodist School System, including:

- To Equip 15 primary, elementary and secondary schools with text books, ebooks, libraries and science laboratories
- To develop culturally relevant and contextually sensitive Christian text books
- To facilitate teacher training
- To employ principals with a minimum of a bachelor's degree in education in all the secondary schools of the church
- To include technical vocational education in secondary schools.

It is our hope that United Methodist Schools will continue to support the government in providing meaningful education for Liberian children while sharing God's love and the message of forgiveness and peace.
