

GROWING YOUNG

Memorial UMC has been selected as one of 30 congregations in our Annual Conference to receive specialize training through May of 2020 in how to reach youth and young adults with the gospel message. Our 10 am Adult Sunday School class has been reading together the book which inspired this training, and three lay people along with our pastor will attend two special workshops.

The first workshop will be in mid-October. After that event, there will be a follow-up event in our congregation to share what is being taught, and to make strategic plans for how we can welcome the generations that are currently under-represented in our congregation. Fínance Report

August Finance Report

Let's shout hooray! The loan principal on our parsonage is now below \$100,000. We have been making one or two extra payments a year and it really makes a difference. After our September payment, we owed \$99,384.94.

The other good news is that we finished August well in the black in our General Fund. We came out of July with a \$2,751 deficit. Income in August totaled \$18,890 and expenses \$12,426 leaving a balance of \$3,713. However, early in September, we had large bills to pay related to the roof repair and to replace a fire door in the education wing. This more than used up the carryover from August.

In October, we will have to pay our annual electric bill, which is much higher than last year, and the quarterly health insurance premium for the pastor. This means we should try to have a carryover from September to cover these.

We did not make a conference tithe (apportionment) payment in August. Thanks to the Thrift Store, in September we will pay the rest of our June payment, all of July and a small part of August.

As of August 31, people who made Estimates of Giving were behind on their contributions by \$12,681. Other people have given even more than their estimates, so they cover some of this deficit. We are hopeful that those who are behind can catch up their giving in October. This would provide more that enough to cover the large October bills.

General Conference

What will happen to our denomination at the General Conference in May of 2020?

Many of you are aware of the decadeslong struggle that has occurred in our denomination over the official stance on how to be in ministry to and with people all along the wide spectrum on of human sexuality.

It had been hoped that the Special Called General Conference held in February of this year to focus on this one issue would help the denomination heal and move to a place of greater unity in mission. This did not occur. Next year's regularly scheduled General Conference will, of necessity, deal with the fallout and ramifications of the decisions passed last February.

Volunteers In Mission trip to Liberia

Volunteers In Mission trip to Liberia, an extension of our Friends of United



Methodist University Liberia (FUMUL), is coming together nicely! Travel dates are January 8-18, 2020. We currently have 5 members of our congregation planning to participate, and 2 people from other congregations also onboard.

Plans are underway to work at a "Mission Station" in Monrovia to run a pediatric wellness clinic for the community, train teachers on computer literacy, work with "Days For Girls" to provide feminine hygiene products to the young women in the school provide some enrichment activities with children after school.

Also, a couple of the team members will travel to Ganta Hospital to do an in-service training on how to use a donated piece of equipment.

It is more cost effective to purchase in Liberia most of the supplies we will need to run the wellness clinic, so we won't be collecting those items. Please keep an eye out in the weekly digest and the

Sunday bulletins to learn of donations that are needed to be carried with us in our luggage.
