#### Finance Report

General Fund income for September was the highest amount we have had so far this year. Let's try to make that a trend and work toward similar increases in the remaining months.

It was fortunate that the income was relatively high, because the expenses for the month were almost tied with January, the highest month of the year.

General Fund income in September totaled \$23,609 while expenses were \$30,477. Because of some late entry donations from online giving, the carryover from August was a positive balance of \$2,097. This leaves a deficit for September of \$4,771.

We did pay the three-month health insurance premium for the pastor's health insurance in September after we finally received the bill from the conference. And we are caught up on his conference pension payments. We also sent the Conference the \$5,000 from the Thrift Store to almost double our conference tithe payment for the year so far. This almost covers our tithe through June, so we will need a good income from donations in the remaining months plus the assistance of the Thrift Store and the Boutique to be able to finish the payments for the year.

Our average General Fund income this year has increased to over \$17,000 a month. We need to average close to \$19,000 a month to keep up with this year's expenditures to date.

At this point in 2019, our income was more than \$17,000 higher than it is this year. If people who are giving less now could return to their 2019 level of giving – or even increase it – we would be in a better position to carry out the work that God has planned for us.

(I wish there were 48 hours in a day and 10 days in a week.) And yes, I also make sure I take my time off to be with my family. I ask that you keep my family and I in your prayers. As your pastor, I want to be and do my best as I also want you to be and do your best as members and friends of our church. When we all do our best, we all grow, more people experience life transformation, God is glorified and His kingdom is expanded.

Friends, our God is an awesome God. He deserves our praise and thanksgiving. I ask you now to take a minute to close our eyes, breath deeply and slowly and contemplate all the blessings He has given to you... If you need, you may take a couple more minutes to pray to God. Offer him your prayer of thanksgiving and prayer of petition. You can also pause for a few second to be in complete silence to listen to Him as well. Pay attend to still small voice that is whispering in your ears.

As we are approaching our holiday season, please pay attention to our church calendar. Our church leaders have been preparing a lot of good events to help you celebrate and that you can invite family members and friends to attend so they can experience God's blessings, grace and love.
