FRESNO DISTRICT LEARNING DAY NOVEMBER 4, 2006 HERE AT MUMC!!!

For the third year we have the great good fortune to host the Fresno District Learning Day event. This year our District Council on Ministries has invited Rev. William Easum to be our teaching leader. Bill, a United Methodist Elder, author of the acclaimed book, *Church Growth Handbook*, is one of the most widely sought advisors on congregational health and vitality in North America.

Bill, the author of many books and articles, writes regularly for *Net Results*, a national evangelism magazine. He grew a dying San Antonio, Texas congregation with a leadership team of 12 dedicated members by 600% to one of the largest churches in America using four basic building blocks: 1) Ministry must be Christ Centered to meet the needs of the people, not the institution. 2) Worship is the initial building block of congregational life, sustained and nurtured by Christian Education. 3) God wants the church to grow and grow. 4) God expects our very best. He cautions the size of a church does not matter - these essential growth principles grow healthy churches with integrity.

The first day, Friday November 3, of the two day event is for clergy and interested leadership on the subject of "The Second Resurrection: How Traditional Clergy Become Spiritual Leaders," 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. The second day, Saturday, November 4, is for every one of us who cares about our church regardless of our age or capacity. The topic for Saturday is "Churches Thrive or Decline: Reasons Churches Grow," 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

As your pastor I want you to understand how vital it is for you to be on board with your leadership's direction, thinking, and understanding. Whether you are able to be as involved as others or not is

irrelevant. What's important is that we are all on the SAME WAVE LENGTH, so as we move in a specific direction, you have insight into why and can help others understand. Your support of your church is vital if it is to be healthy. Healthy churches growth Disciples for Jesus Christ.

There is nothing worse or more destructive to the health of a church than uninformed assumptions and attitudes that cling to past experiences for our models for today. As cherished as those memories may be, they will kill our future quicker than anything. I love this church. I am passionate about the message of Jesus Christ we have to show and tell our community. As long as I am your Pastor, I will fight to my dying breath for its ministry and vitality. How about you? There's only one thing I am not willing to work with and that is willful ignorance. If you honestly don't know and want to know, that's a horse of a different color.

Be here for this event—if you can't stay all day come part of the day. Pray for this event. Pray for Bill's wellbeing, and that the Holy Spirit will open our hearts and minds to receive the gifts God has given Bill to give to us. Scholarships are available to cover the registration. Registration includes lunch. Free childcare is available both days with advance notice. The cost is \$75.00 for both days and \$49.00 for one day. The District Council will pay for the third and fourth registration of every church and the Fresno Mission and Church Extension Society will pay for the seventh and eighth and we at Memorial will subsidize any one with financial need.
