#### Help for the Homeless

The Homeless Ministry Team is in the process of developing a list of sundries and toiletries we will be collecting for the homeless. We will need such things as travel size toothpaste, tooth brushes, wash cloths and hand towels, etc. Watch for the list.

Meanwhile, check with family, friends and neighbors and begin collecting up old but useable back packs. Kids generally get new ones each year and the old ones often get stuffed into a closet and forgotten about. Please be sure that zippers work and straps are intact ink marks are okay.

Plans include providing foods the homeless can use without having cooking facilities and will include small metal can openers. The team will be contacting the Clovis Police Department Community Officer in hopes of supporting them in their work with the homeless with these projects and to find out more about what our community is doing for the homeless and how we can help.

We prayed for each others' concerns and people on the Special Friends lists. We gave thanks for successful surgeries and raised up those recovering from surgery.

We are making progress on our priorities for 2007. Our priorities are:

- 1. Reach a New Generation with a Contemporary Worship Service.
- 2. Reach Senior Adults with a Vital Elder Ministry
- 3. Staff for Growth
- 4. Increase Our Visibility in Our Community with Advertising
- 5. Plan a New Facility for Thrift Shop/Recycle/Administration and Youth Ministries
- 6. Sponsor a Missionary

Our Missions Team and UMW have selected Carol Partridge, UM missionary to Macedonia for our Covenant Partnership. Sue DeFranco has created a wonderful, informative educational display about Carol and Macedonia which is on a table in the entrance hall of the church. Look for it. The 2006 Christmas boutique raised the funds required for this year's commitment.

Under the leadership of Gloria McClannahan and team, we have a launched a campaign to reach out and increase our visitors to our church with the "Our Hearts and Doors are Always Open for You" invitation cards and our open house target Sunday, March 11, 2007 . Door hangers will soon be available for all us to use in our neighborhoods as well. New lighting on the monument sign and repainting of the letters has spiffed up our sign. Plans are in the works to add the worship and church school times. The Mature Adult Ministry Team will have met by the time you receive this newsletter and you will be hearing more about plans to meet the needs of senior adults.

As for the priority to reach a new generation, we are in the process of writing and submitting a grant to the Fresno Mission and Church Extension Society as part of our plan to provide a contemporary worship service and a part time staff person to coordinate and develop supportive ministries that will meet the needs of families, youth and children. We will need publicity mailings and a pianist etc. We are fortunate to have a strong youth program and will be working on ways to expand and reach out to youth in our community. We will be gathering all of the younger generation here at church for a meal and sharing session around the new service soon.

In conjunction with these last two priorities, the Korean church has offered us the donation of a church van which would greatly facilitate our outreach capabilities as well as our Hmong ministry. For example we have members at senior residences such as Yosemite Gardens who cannot now get out to worship because they have no transport.

We also have youth who cannot get out to youth activities, worship or Sunday school for the same reason. How nice it would be to offer CSUF students who need a ride to church a pick up! We will be looking at the costs involved, the feasibility, insurance, maintenance, licensing, and possible ways of funding etc. etc. in the weeks ahead.

We will be reworking our Sunday morning worship schedule to accommodate a traditional service of worship and a contemporary service of worship. A survey will be coming out in the weeks ahead for your feed back with suggested service times.

The priority to replace the Thrift Shop is yet to be tackled. If you are interested, please let me know. We want to have our plans in place by March of 2009 when the mortgage on the social hall is paid off. Boy! Won't that be a day to celebrate! Those of you who had the foresight to build the social hall and educational wing with the play yard have provided for the future that is our present! May we follow your example and provide for the future ministry a head of us all!

I think I'm coming back to life again—it's nice to see the lilac beginning to bud out in the yard and the bulbs beginning to bloom. Spring isn't far off. God's plan for renewal is a gift each year the warming weather opens for us. How reviving it is.

But there are still at least three weeks of blustery weather ahead of us with time for introspection during the season of Lent. Each Sunday I will be inviting you to add a spiritual discipline to practice. The First Sunday of Lent I challenged us all to join Jesus in fasting—not for 40 days but for 1 meal a week or if medically and physically able for 3 meals; and to put the money that would have been spent on these meals into an offering envelop marked Homeless Ministry to be placed in the offering plate on Palm/Passion Sunday.

Fasting is an ancient practice of the church which helps us remember our dependence on God from whom all good gifts come. It also helps us focus on the reality of hunger in our world as we experience what it feels like to be genuinely hungry. In the absence of food may we seek the will of God for us in meeting the needs of our neighbors. This is what Jesus did.

Giving something up for Lent—such as food or a regular pleasure is a way to sharpen our awareness of the reality of life without God's goodness at work in the world. When we give something up we can do it as an act of contrition as well. Offering something to God through selfdenial is away to acknowledge our selfcenteredness and misdirected living and how we regularly block out the need of neighbor, the suffering of others because we are so insulated in our affluent busy lives.

And finally the spiritual practice of self-denial is another way for us to recall the self-giving of God in Christ who willingly gave all for us. As members of his body our tactile awareness of deprivation is a small way of recalling his wounds, his stripes, and his suffering death. A death others suffer daily in places such as Darfur, Zimbabwe, South Africa, Nigeria, Palestine, Iraq and in the homes of American families whose sons and daughters have paid the ultimate sacrifice in war.

Then, when Easter dawns we will have trod the way to the cross having meditated on its full implications for the way we live and for the work we are called to in this world. Our alleluias will be heartfelt and fearless joy.
