Think this over friends; you know what's right from wrong.




TECH SUPPORT TEAM HAS MINISTRY OPENINGS

We again had good "stuff" and it is already looking like this next month will be creditable as well. Thanks and keep those donations coming! Don't even think of giving them to


Good Will!!

Sprinkler System Problems

A note from the Facilities Maintenance Team: Sometime within the last couple of weeks, a break occurred in the underground water lines leading to the sprinkler system on Pollasky that waters the ornamental plants in front of the

parking lot. Some observant passerby noticed that water was coming to the surface from underground and turned off the valve that controls flow to the affected line. Unfortunately, nobody on the Facilities Maintenance Team was notified, so the underlying problem persisted until a routine check of the system was done in preparation for the summer months. It is now repaired, but the result of not reporting the problem was



the loss of three or four ornamental plants. Also, having the valve off while the timer continued to operate could have resulted in burning out the solenoid on the valve. Anyone noticing a problem with the irrigation system should contact Jim McClanahan. Thank you.
