WORSHIP ANNOUNCEMENTS - A MOVING TARGET After experimenting during Advent with having the

announcements in the middle of the service, the Worship team's evaluation is that they need to return it to the top of the service, but inside the worship hour rather than before worship begins. The new pattern will be: Welcome, Announcements, Greeting One Another. With this new pattern it will be very, very important for all of us to plan ahead and get our announcements to Jim Acton either on a white card prior to the service OR by email. Announcements printed in the bulletin will now be projected on the screen to help highlight



them, reduce paper and time spent on announcements. So we ask that no verbal announcements be made repeating print announcements. Also, if you need to make a verbal announcement, keep it to 30 seconds, come to the mic and "line up" behind Jim immediately. Of course plans change or information gets scrambled or omitted and announcements need to be made—the whole idea is simply to keep announcements specific, applicable to the whole body, and brief so information gets out appropriately and we don't cut into worship. LESLIE'S SALT SHAKER: PRAYER CELLS BEGIN THIS MONTH Knowing God's will for our lives is the hearts desire and the souls deep longing. This fall many of you signed on and are signing on to participate in small prayer cells. I am now in the process of initiating those cells. Since we have so many it will take a while! I will initiate and orient each group. I will contact you as to when your cell will have its first meeting. We will meet in my living room. At that meeting the group will build community. The group will also determine who will be the group facilitator and for how long that person desires to serve. The responsibility of the facilitator is to follow the group meeting format and receive the inspiration for the meeting which will be provided. Your group will determine the best time and place to meet: in a home, rotate homes, at the church? An evening or day time meeting? And how often the group will convene: monthly or twice a month?



I will converse regularly with each facilitator for a while and then quarterly for ongoing support, monitoring of how things are going. Prayer cell facilitators will participate in the Leadership Network as well. You will be scheduled for your first meeting soon. If you haven't done so and would like to participate, call, speak to, or email me. I will be working consistently on initiating new groups from now on. Groups will not exceed five or six members. If you have a friend outside the church who would like to participate, please invite them and give me their name.

SPIRIT QUEST NEW MEMBERSHIP CLASS FORMING If you have been attending MUMC for a while and are interested in exploring membership, please join the pastor in her office on Sunday mornings at 9:30 beginning Sunday mornings for "Connecting to the Church," Class 1 in the Spirit Quest Maturing in Discipleship series. It addresses the faith question: "How does my faith fit/connect with the church?" Watch for announcements of other Spirit Quest Classes. They may be taken in any order:

Class 1: <u>Coming to Faith</u> This class addresses the Faith Question: "What needs do I bring with me which faith in Jesus Christ and church can address? It explores who Jesus Christ is.

Class 3: <u>Practicing My Faith.</u> This class addresses the Faith Question: "What does it mean to walk faithfully with Jesus?"

Class 4: <u>Ministry and Mission</u>. This class addresses the Faith Question: "What is God's ministry or mission call to me as a disciple of Jesus?"

Class 5: <u>Sustaining/Visioning Leadership.</u> This class addresses the Faith Question, "What is God calling me as a leader of leaders to do that will transform lives and the world through the gospel of Jesus Christ?"

<u>COACHES CORNER</u> It's time to get organized for a new year of ministry. You will find lots of useful information in this issue of the Good News. Please hang on to it for future reference. Please review the Lay Leadership Report enclosed and report errors, omissions, and updates to the office. The Leadership Network meets this month on the second Sunday. This group will be the



heart beat of the congregation. If you are a leader of anything, be there. This is where we will network what's happening around here, provide support, seek input from the larger congregation and hold each other accountable for our discipleship leadership. I want to remind us of our Growth Strategy as we begin the new year as well. <u>A</u> third prong is being added to it.

<u>The First Prong</u> is to grow a strong vital older adult ministry (OAM) that addresses the spiritual and life transition needs of senior adults. We –all of us-- will be working on getting the word out to the senior adults of Clovis. To that end let people know and plan now to attend: we are offering an OAM seminar weekend, *Coming Fully Alive*, February 29 and March 1, 2008, provided by Senior New Ways and made possible through a grant from our conference's Beulah Foundation. As we enact our second prong (see next) the current service will be even more directed to meeting the needs of the older adult.

<u>The Second Prong</u> is to reach a younger generation (people your children's age) through a new second English service. A team of people continues to meet to plan this service. We will be looking at Sunday morning scheduling and seeking feed back from the congregation through a worship time survey. Research shows the best way to grow a church our size is to add a new service targeting a new group.

<u>The Third Prong</u> is to become multicultural. We have three United Methodist congregations meeting in our facility. Currently the Hmong speakers are members of Memorial. We are hoping to build an alliance among all three congregations, English, Hmong and Korean, under Memorial's banner that will bring us into a federated mission and ministry together.

California is multi-cultural and Clovis is becoming increasingly multi-cultural. I know my neighborhood at Armstrong and Shaw is. Getting the word out we offe services in three languages: Korean, English and Hmong will grow us and serve more people in our community. Divided we fall, together we not only stand but thrive into the next three decades.

Building use creates tensions and a landlord tenant mentality. This is not what Jesus would have. We pastors, Paul Joseph Yang, Young Kim and myself are working toward building a strong covenant of Christian commitment. We will be working on building that bond among us as congregations as well. Communication and building personal relationships are key to helping that happen. And remembering that its not about the "American" or "Hmong" or "Korean" way, its about THE JESUS WAY. Jesus is our leader, our friend, our Lord and our Savior. Together with him we can confess our "James and John" desire to be first in the Kingdom and instead do as our Lord commanded on Maundy Thursday (Maundy = mandatum= commandment): take a towel and wash each others feet in humble servant leadership. Open your hearts, open your minds, open your doors all ye United Methodists!
