**HEALING SERVICE MEETS SECOND TUESDAY IN MARCH** The Healing Service usually meets on the first Tuesday of the month at 7 p.m. in the sanctuary. In March it will be held the second Tuesday, March 8, 2008. This is a service of prayer, song, communion and an opportunity to kneel at the rail for anointing of oil and prayer for specific concerns. Join us for a quiet, restorative worship experience, and remember, a Healing Prayer station is available every communion Sunday at the back of the sanctuary during communion.

PALM/PASSION SUNDAY WITH PALM PROCESSION MARCH 16

Palm Sunday worship begins with a palm procession of children and passion readers who will gather at 9:45 a.m. to line up. Palm fronds and Eco-Green Balloons will be available. Following the liturgy of the Palms the message of the morning will be a dramatic narrative reading of the Passion of Jesus according to Matthew interspersed with hymns. The Stripping of the Church by the Chancel Choir will conclude the service.

**HOLY THURSDAY SERVICE AND SIMPLE SUPPER** Mark your calendars for Holy Thursday worship, March 20. The evening will begin with a "Simple Supper" at 6 p.m. in the social hall consisting of foods which Jesus and the disciples would have eaten at the Passover Meal of the Last Supper. This is a potluck. Soup and beverage is provided. Please bring fruits, nuts, and cheeses to accompany the soup. The service will begin at 7 p.m. in the sanctuary and will include a communion supper in the manner of the last supper with unleavened bread and hymns.

**GOOD FRIDAY SERVICES** Academy church will provide a service of Tenebrae (the extinguishing of lights) as the passion narrative from the Gospel of John is read at 7:00 p.m. under the leadership of George and Lucy Elgin. Memorial church will provide a service featuring the reproaches as the cross is carried down the aisle, and laid on the chancel steps for prayer around the cross at 7 p.m. in the sanctuary. The historic Academy church is located on Madsen off Tollhouse/168. Take 168 east, past Academy Rd to left on Madsen.

**EASTER SUNRISE SERVICE AT ACADEMY CHURCH** Rise! Shine! And celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ on Easter Sunday morning, March 23, at 6:30 a.m. for an Easter Sunrise Service at Academy Church. See directions to church under Good Friday services announcement.

#### EASTER VICTORY CELEBRATION PROCESSION AND RETURN OF THE LIGHT

Easter Service at Memorial will begin at 10:30 a.m. out front of the sanctuary with the lighting of the Paschal Candle to lead the Victory Procession into the church. You may gather outside for the procession or take a seat inside. Light form the Paschal Candle, symbolizing the return of Christ, the Light of the World will be spread through the congregation. The lights will come up as we shout "He is risen indeed!" and we sing "Christ the Lord is Risen Today." A flower cross for children to cover with roses will be a part of the Victory procession as we bring the Resurrection beauty into the church. All children, parents, choir members, youth and young adults will gather at 10:15 a.m. in the social hall to line up for the procession and receive lilies, flowers and other sanctuary items. The processors will gather out front for the lighting of the Paschal candle and follow the candle into the church.

LESLIE'S SALT SHAKER I love pretzels. Especially chocolate covered pretzels. Lent and Easter season is a great excuse to indulge! I know, and you thought it was all about giving up chocolate and the like! It's about practicing the presence of God-both in abstinence and indulgence. You see, it's about doing what draws your heart to God first. Sometimes that happens when we find we are without something we enjoy, rely on and find absent (by choice) through the days of Lent. Other times, its about looking at a pretzel's crossed arms, recalling this is a sign of prayer with God, savoring the smell of fresh baked pretzels as they come out of the oven and the salty savor or that first bite of a Hot Cross bun and remembering to "taste and see the goodness of the Lord."
