ANNUAL CONFERENCE WELCOMES VISITORS JUNE 18-21: The annual meeting of our California-Nevada Conference is June 18 - 21 at the Sacramento Community (Convention) Center on J St between 13th and 15th streets. Visitors are welcome. To see the schedule go to cnumc.org and click on Annual Conference. On that page click on Annual Conference Session and go to the ACS letter for a schedule. Seating for visitors is provided in the exhibit hall where the plenary sessions are held and each evening offers an inspirational opportunity including the Celebration of Bishop Shamana on her retirement as our Bishop Friday evening. You may contact the office for details if you do not have internet access. The Conference Offering for this year will be on 6/15/08. The offering will support two projects close to the heart of our Bishop. Half of the offering will be used to fund grants for creative arts ministries that support the making of Disciples of Jesus Christ for the Transformation of the World, and in recognition of Bishop Shamana's commitment to our partnership with the West Angola Conference of the United Methodist Church, half of the offering will be used to fund an agricultural irrigation project that teaches local farmers ways to increase food production for their families and community. We will also collect eyeglasses and old cell phones to take with us. Bring these items to the church and place them in the collection boxes located in the Narthex by June 15. Thank you so much for your help.

WORSHIP PLANNING SUMMARY May 10, 2008: The Worship Planning Team had another productive meeting on May 10. Included in the agenda were updates on plans for the second English Language service and preliminary results of the survey suggesting that most prefer the 11:00 a.m. time for the current service. Discussion of the expanded use of the Hospitality Team might incorporate duties of ushers and greeters. The PIE group will be reinstated to visit newcomers after service and deliver literature and a personal Pastor Denice suggested an welcome. information booth manned to provide directions and literature to newcomers. Suggestions also involved change of the coffee hour to occur between services and the possibility of having a coffee cart to facilitate relocating the hospitality table near the message board outside the Fellowship Hall. Small tables and chairs and a canopy could be provided for those who want to remain outside with easy access to the Fellowship Hall for those who prefer to sit indoors. Several logistical issues were addressed, including Ron's presentation of options for a screen in the rear of the sanctuary. Plans for music were presented by Scott. Pastor Denice introduced the Vital Signs book to address the decline in the conference with the Mission: to make disciples for the transformation of the world; and the Vision: empower servant leadership. Worship Plans were completed through June 15 using the lections. The next meeting will be June 14.

FROM THE PASTOR

LESLIE'S SALT SHAKER: I was intrigued by a colleague's encouragement for all of us to take seriously "holy napping." With technological progress making access a virtual reality 24/7 via fax, modem, email, cell phones, blackberries and the like, we Americans are "on," available or working nearly 24/7! The balance in life evaporates without clear boundaries, without taking time to make self-care a priority. There is, after all, always, more to do than there is time in a day.

Jesus reminds us life consists of more than work or worry over how we will secure what we need. And life consists of more than the frenetic pace to "enjoy it all"—plan and "go, go, go" all the time. Stop and smell the flowers is the message Jesus gives us of "consider the lilies of the field... how they neither toil nor spin."

We live with many "shoulds" and "oughts" –messages about how our homes, our yards, our persons "should" appear, "ought" to be together. Success is defined by more and better and greater and bigger. The "good life" is defined by how much we can pack into it.

Jesus defines success by how loving our relationships are, how ethical in our dealings with others we are, if we love our neighbors as ourselves. And there is the key: learning to love and respect ourselves as precious children of God so we can in turn give the same to others. Do we connect on a daily basis with God—are we listening for the nudging, guidance and warnings of the Holy Spirit?

So...we started out considering "Holy Napping." As the dog days of summer come on and the mid day heat feels oppressive and your body calls for stillness and quiet —*listen,* and take that break, that nap. The Holy Spirit's work among us is to refresh us so we may be living refreshment for others.
