If you would like to donate food to the pantry, here is a list of what goes into the bags for the hungry: boxed cereal, dry milk or boxed soy-milk, bottled fruit juice, canned fruit, canned veggies, canned meat or tuna, peanut butter, dried beans or canned beans, rice or spaghetti, tomato paste or sauce or canned tomatoes, mac and cheese or rice a roni, canned or packaged soup, and crackers. We can also use paper grocery sacks to put the food in. If you donate food and have a store receipt with the purchases on it, you can give it to Sara or Diane, and it will go on your statement of giving from the church for tax purposes. We truly appreciate every donation that we get. Thank you.
