WHERE DO I GO WHEN I HAVE A QUESTION ABOUT ANY THING AFFECTING OUR CHURCH? We longtime Methodists are used to many different names of units that cover administrative and policy decisions of the church: i.e Church Council, Administrative Board, Official Board, Trustees, yes there are likely many more that cover this situation. Therefore the question becomes: "What is the current administrative structure of Memorial United Methodist Church?" The answer is The Administrative Support Team which meets the 4th Tuesday of every month at 4:30PM, The team is composed of: A chairperson (currently John Erb), Endowment chair, Financial off icier, Building use coordinator, Lay leader, and representatives from Staff Parish Relations, Facilities Maintenance, Finance Team .Hmong Leadership and all elected Trustees.

The purpose of the Administrative Support Team: "To make policy decisions related to the different finance and facilities teams when needed as well as be the official administrative agent of the Charge Conference between meetings of the Charge Conference. This Team also deals with any Disciplinary mandates relating to finances, facilities or personnel as required. The Trustees of the corporation serve on the Administrative Support Team. The Team also relates to any new or existing ministries around policies for use of the facilities or budget needs. The Staff Parish Relations Committee relates to the Administrative Support Team. So what does all this mean? If you, as an interested person of this congregation have a question regarding some action

affecting The Church, you have every right and are encouraged to attend the next Administrative Support Team meeting and have that item entered into the agenda.

So why all this complicated explanation? This is an effort to curb "rumors" that have a way of becoming "fact", before anyone on The Team has had a chance to address the issue. Instead of playing the children's game of passing on a story, let us get to the bottom of the issue before it becomes a "fact". If anyone has any questions regarding this procedure, please give me a call and we can discuss the issue further. One note of exception is that if your question concerns a church employee, that request MUST go to the Staff Parish Relations Committee.

TWO PEWS IN CENTER BACK REMOVED TO MAKE SPACE: Some months ago the Worship Plan Team received approval from the Administrative Support Team to remove two of the center back pews, one on either side of the center aisle for the purpose of providing much needed space for the Sound and Projection equipment and tech-

nicians on the left hand side and wheel chair and soft seating on the right hand side. Folks who have difficulty sitting in the pews due to the need for padding bottom or back, or rising from a sitting position off the pews or who have walkers or other mobility assistance equipment now have alternative seating. The two pews removed are positioned along the north and south walls. To prevent the possibility of injury, please do not sit on these two pews until the signs are removed as they may tip forward and are very, very heavy! Efforts to stabilize the pews are in the works.

MINISTRY SPOTLIGHT

EQUIPPING MINISTRIES: Starting in February our equipper, Sara Glazebrook, will be contacting a few people every week via postal mail to invite them to meet with her to discuss their passions or frustrations in ministry. FOUR BASIC MINISTRY TEAMS PROVIDE BACKBONE OF DISCIPLING AT MUMC: The following four basic team provide a system for fulfilling our vision of Empowering Servant Leadership, and aligning our ministries with our mission of Showing and Telling Jesus' Love Everywhere. These Basic Ministry System Teams are:

-The Administrative Support Team: responsible for finance and facilities policies and procedures. The AST has a cluster of work teams that relate to it: Facilities Maintenance, Staff Parish Relations, Finance Work Team, Fundraising, Renovation, Counters, Office Finance Team, Prayer Gardens, Memorials and Gifts, Endowment. It meets the fourth Tuesday of the month at 4:30 p.m. in the Lose Library. The AST includes the Trustees who are the legal officers of the corporation.

-<u>Leader Network:</u> The Leader Network is a quarterly meeting on a Sunday after the second worship hour in the Lose Library and is composed of all the team leaders of every ministry and mission group in the congregation. It meets for support, connecting new comers to mission and ministry, calendaring and coordinating and delegating the planning of church wide activities. It also acts as a two-way communication vehicle between teams and leadership on issues affecting the whole body of the church. There are currently over forty different ministries at MUMC.

-Spiritual Leaders: The Spiritual Leaders Circle meets monthly after the late service on the first Sunday of the month in the Lose Library. The Spiritual Leaders provide spiritual direction for the They provide direction for the congregation. course of our ministry via a Horizon Line report to Charge Conference annually. They support existing ministries and as keepers of the vision, mission and core values are responsible for aligning new ministries with our vision, mission and core values as we seek God's will and guidance in all of our They are responsible for leader's endeavors. growth in discipleship as well as for assessing the health and vitality of the congregation and making recommendations.

-The Equipping Team is responsible for equipping lay leadership through the matching of individual gifts and call to ministry. It also manages the five stage Spirit Quest Discipleship process of classes designed to mature disciples and provide a Ministry Gifts Discovery Process. It annually fills vacan-

cies for those offices required by the Discipline and prepares the Lay Leadership Report.
