**PALM/PASSION SUNDAY COMBINED WORSHIP AT 11 A.M.:** Palm Sunday is also Passion Sunday on Sunday, April 5. We will have one service of worship with a Palm Processional at the top of the service with a Time for Children with Barbara Grams followed by a dramatic reading of the Passion of Jesus according to the Gospel of Mark and the Stripping of the Church. Families, youth, young adults are invited to join the Praise Team and Passion Readers in the Palm Procession. Gather in the lobby at 10:45 a.m.

**HOLY THURSDAY SIMPLE SUPPER APRIL 9, 6 P.M.:** Our annual Simple Supper after the manner of Jesus and the disciples partook at the last supper will be in the social hall at 6 p.m. on Thursday, April 9, at 6 p.m. Please bring dried fruit, grapes, cheeses, cracker breads. Soup and beverage provided. Holy Thursday Communion service follows at 7p.m. in the sanctuary.

**HOLY THURSDAY COMMUNION WITH DRAMATIC MESSAGE:** Holy Thursday service with communion with the message brought to us via the vehicle of drama will be held Thursday, April 9 at 7 p.m. in the sanctuary. Communion will be in the manner of the Upper Room meal.

**GOOD FRIDAY SERVICES: MEMORIAL AND ACADEMY, APRIL 10**: Friday, April 10 we will have two Good Friday Services: A service of Tenebrae: the Service of Extinguishing Lights as the Passion of the gospel of John is narrated will be held at the historic Academy church at 4 p.m. A service of Prayer Around the Cross with a brief message will be held at Memorial in the sanctuary at 7 p.m.

**EASTER SUNDAY SUNRISE SERVICE 7:00 A.M.**: Greet the rising sun on Easter Sunday, April 12 at 7:00 a.m. at historic Academy church on Madsen Ave. Take 168/Tollhouse east past Academy to Madsen. Make a left turn on Madsen. Church up on the left. Dress warmly.

**EASTER CELEBRATION SERVICE 11 A.M.**: Celebrate the resurrection on Easter Sunday at 11:00 am in a combined service of worship. Those who are able will gather out side the front of the sanctuary for the beginning of the service with the Return of the Light. After the new fire of Easter is spread to the congregation, the Easter Victory Procession will dispel the darkness as all sing "Christ the Lord Is Risen Today." The Chancel Choir and the Imagine! Praise Band will provide music. Janette Erickson will perform *Panis Angelicus* on flute for the offertory. Families, youngsters and anyone interested are invited to be part of the Victory Procession to bring Easter into the sanctuary including the flowers of Easter day. The procession will form beginning at 10:30 a.m. out front of the sanctuary.

## **Upcoming** Events

EASTER OFFERING 2009: Our Easter offering will be split between two funds this year, one that reaches out around the United States and the world and the other benefiting a project a little closer to home. The World Service Fund is part of our connectional giving that supports missionaries and their ministries in the areas of spiritual growth, education, medicine, community development, etc. in over 80 countries around the world and in the United States. Our mission speaker from March 29th, Carol Partridge and her wonderful work in Macedonia is directly supported by this fund. Our Easter offering will also benefit the Volunteers in Mission program of our California-Nevada Conference. This group of dedicated volunteers is planning a much-needed "Habitat for Christ" renovation of the Oroville Hmong pastor's home. At this point in time the house is basically a shack, but with a little help from conference brothers and sisters the dedicated group of volunteers will be able to buy materials and complete this worthwhile project. The Micah Ministries Team encourages you to help us fulfill the mission of our church, to go and show Jesus' love everywhere, by giving generously to our Easter offering this year.

**SPIRITUAL LEADERS WILL MEET PALM SUNDAY:** If you are scheduled for your ministry conversation for Sunday, April 5 the Spiritual Leaders will meet in the Lose Library following the 11 a.m. worship service.

**LENT FOOD DRIVE:** Please return your nonperishable food donations for our Lent Food Drive on Palm Sunday. Your sacrificial gift of food will help our Food Pantry meet the needs of hungry in our area. Our goal- 40 bags of food, one for each of the 40 days of Lent. Any surplus food will go the Clovis Salvation Army for their outreach into the Clovis community.

**FORTY DAYS ON FOOT:** The Lenten Jog-athon continues until Easter. There is still time to make a pledge to support our Ethnic Minority apportionment. The conference asks us to give \$2,101 for our share of this important ministry which helps fund programs such as our Hmong Ministry. Funding is down throughout the conference and the committee may not be able to help us out this year. However, since we have benefited in the past, we have a certain obligation to do our best to fulfill our responsibility. Remember that this is really a mission program that helps fund mission work in our own community. It's not too late to be a participant in the 40 Days on Foot, either. If you get this by April 1, you still have eight days to walk, run, bike or whatever in support of this mission while getting healthful exercise at the same time. Pick up a pledge sheet and a mileage log in the Narthex.

# MINISTRY SPOTLIGHT

**<u>COMMUNITY GARDEN:</u>** Ten years ago last month, Houa Lee and I went to the Harvard Arms apartments over on Barstow and offered the Hmong ladies there what Houa called "a little bit of dirt" to garden in. The knot of ladies gathered became so excited you would have thought they had just won the lottery. And in

way they did. We had about a third of an acre of vacant land west of the social hall that was a dumping ground for trash, chunks of cement and dirt piles and was then growing a great crop of puncture vines. For a couple of years, I had wanted to turn it into a community garden but didn't know where to start until Rev. Sharon Stanley of Fresno Interdenominational Refugees Ministries came to speak at our church. FIRM already had other community gardens and the person who could be our contact with our Hmong neighbors - Houa Lee. They also offered a grant to fund the project. We signed up ten gardeners who happened to be lucky enough to be standing in that initial gathering at Harvard Arms and began the task of turning the dumping ground into a garden. Spring planting months passed while we ironed out details with the trustees and the city. The children in our Growing Spiritual Families helped clear away trash. Round-up took care of the weeds and a tractor leveled and furrowed the field. Finally, after their eagerness to plant was turning into anxiety over the wait, the first seeds went into the ground in June – but the ten gardeners had to share one hose attached to the spigot on the social hall because we were still waiting to get the irrigation system in. Howard Vollman, Rich Bonzo and others joined the gardeners and me in digging about 500 feet of trench and turning our hands purple for the summer as we glued together hundreds of feet of pipe and valves. Sometimes we thought it would never be done, but eventually the difficulties were taken care of, including one neighbor who found all sorts of things to complain about, including the fact that the gardeners talked while they were caring for their crops. For ten summers now, we've been able watch this little bit of dirt grow not only crops, but healthy bodies for the gardeners and their families and the self-esteem that comes with providing for their families by doing the work they were born to do. Denice once said that we are blessed when we are a part of the lives of those who are disadvantaged or distressed in some way because that is where we meet God. Our community garden has offered us that opportunity. The garden,

like an oyster, has taken a little bit of dirt and made a pearl.
