The 30-Hour Famine is a nationwide "hunger-athon" event, during which we go for thirty hours without food to gain an understanding of what it feels like to be hungry. We will begin our fast Friday night, and meet at the church at 8:00 a.m. Saturday, to spend the day together in study, service projects, and fellowship. After a sleepover at the church Saturday night, we will break our fast together Sunday morning before church. Money will be generated from a car wash held that Sunday morning, the 28th at 9:30 a.m., and will be donated to the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR), to help fight hunger on a global scale. If you need a voucher for reimbursement, they are located in the drawer on the back of the counter labeled Vouchers. Fill out and submit with receipt, after getting signature of your team leader or another member of your team and put in the Treasurer's box.

If you are a leader of a team, be sure to regularly check your team's mail box. If you want something to go on the web, let Sara know and she and Ron Zastovnik will get it up. AND you can also upload pictures to the Web on your own by following the instructions on our web site.

If you want to get information into the bulletin insert or the Good News submit your information either by email or in writing by dropping it in the Good News basket or the Bulletin Insert basket.

Sara, our secretary, controls the calendar. If you wish to reserve a room or space for an activity, fill out the Calendar slip and if you want an email reminder but that on there too and put in Sara's basket on her desk.

Anhello Tree: What About The Unread Deep Longings?

There were so many responses to the invitation to share longings for God's promised future by completing the sentence, "I long for the day when....." written by worshipers on the lavender, blue and white fan folded slips of paper that our Advent Anhello Tree (Tree of Deep Longing) bloomed with hope all through the Advent season; a wonderful visual of our expectation and anticipation of God's work. Because we were only able to read a few of the longings each Sunday in both worship services, we barely made a dent in the number of buds that fanned out into full blooms. Those that were read expressed very moving, poignant and heartfelt longings ranging from desires for loved ones, local concerns to world peace. Rest assured, no desire will go unread and lifted up. The remaining longings have been removed and I am reading 6 -8 at a time and offering them in daily prayer. Thank you to all who participated in helping us catch a vision of God's will for all of creation as we prepared for God's coming to us in Christ.

Ordinary Time Leads to Transfiguration

In January we entered into Ordinary Time as we move from the celebration of the Epiphany (making Jesus person and mission known) with the challenge in the gospel readings to reflect on our mission as a church and our lived out faith as disciples. Finally we follow Jesus up the mountain where the light becomes so obvious its unavoidable message blinds us with the persistence of

God's intent. Then on the heels of St. Valentine's Day, February 14, which falls on a Sunday this year, is Ash Wednesday with our Ash Service February 17 at 7 p.m. The Wow! Potluck Diners Group is having a Fat Tuesday meal the Tuesday before at 5:45 p.m. on February 16 in the Fellowship Hall. February Paradox of Valentines, Fat and Ash

The idea of Fat Tuesday known traditionally as Shrove Tuesday means to shrove or rid one's kitchen of all fat: lard, butter, cream, saved grease for cooking and the like as a spiritual discipline for "giving up" these "comfort food" ingredients and turning one's heart instead to a renewed focus on God. And of course what better way to do that than to have a party! A Mardi Grass like in New Orleans! Sin boldly in order to repentant (?) Anyway—it's fun!

An Attitude for Lent

This year I would like to encourage us to enter Lent with a sense of anticipation in a similar way as we entered the season of Advent: with a hopeful expectancy of the mighty activity of God in our midst with the continued power of the Spirit at work through us to make real what God has done, is doing and will do. Hmm...Tree of Deep Longing for God's Promised future to the Resurrection Victory Garden on Easter morning! What a strong visual image of God's saving grace at work in our world to overcome life –denying death dealing forces.
