<u>CONGREGATIONS FUND:</u> Over the years we have received \$279,000.00 (!) from our California-Nevada conference churches in support of Hmong ministry here at Memorial. That is a lived grace! That is true Christian community! Think of all the little United Methodist Churches in every burg and hamlet and metropolitan area all over central to northern California and our fourteen churches in Nevada and how they've all provided for us out of their means! This year we have decided to make the Ethnic Minority Congregations Fund our Easter Offering in thanksgiving for life lived in shared mission that we may help out other missions just like our own in other parts of our conference and continue funding Hmong ministry all over the annual conference with pastoral support as well as other ethnic evangelistic missions. So give generously that we may be a part of new life in Christ for new Christians among new communities of Americans. Watch your mail for the Easter letter and Easter Offering Envelope.

HEARING ASSISTANCE: Memorial has a number of hearing assist receivers for anyone who has difficulty hearing in the Sanctuary. In fact they really make it easier to hear, even if you have good hearing. There are two types of earphones that can be used with the receivers.

1) The traditional type of head phones that are held over the ears with a band over the head. If you have hearing aids in both ears, this may be the type you need. The church has a few headphones.

2) Small ear buds that stick in your ears like what is used for iPods, and other portable audio devices. They are very easy to put in and don't mess up the hair. They are not very noticeable in the ear. They will not work with a hearing aid in the ear. We don't keep earbuds on hand because there is sanitary concerns as they may have been in other people's ears. The solution is to bring your own. If you don't wear hearing aids and would like to hear with both ears, you can buy a pair of stereo ear buds almost anywhere. (K-mart, Walmart, Target, Kmart, Rite aid, CVS, Sears, etc.) and bring the with you to church. They cost between \$6 and \$15. (The type used with cell phones and wireless phones will not work.) We do have two types that you can buy and keep: Stereo ear buds to use with both ears, or just use one in one ear. These do have a tendency to get tangled. Cost: \$5 single earbud for use in one ear. Less tendency to tangle. Cost \$10 Contact the church office or Ron Zastovnik.
