FROM THE PASTOR

Romans chapter 8 has a wealth of wisdom to share with us on our everyday life journey. Today I am especially thinking of verses 26-28. In these verses Paul describes the work of the spirit in prayer – interceding for us when we do not have the words to articulate pains we carry in the core of our being. "The spirit speaks for us in groans to deep for words."

This year in my pastoral ministry I have encountered an exceptional amount of pain — both in Trinity and here at Memorial. We are going through a time of upheaval that brings with it loss, discomfort and a measure of instability. Many of us in our personal lives are passing through a period of great loss: perhaps the death of a loved one, the loss of employment and/or home, the breaking of a marriage, the wonderings of our children, the concern for the environment — particularly the long-term damage by wars and oil spills... There is much pain around us, among us, and within us.

I have asked people to pray (at least 15 minutes in one block, at least 3 times a week, for starters). I encourage you to remember that listening is part of prayer: listening to the spirit's prayer – groans to deep for words. Listen, too, to God's response – to bring hope and comfort in amazing and surprising ways.

Verse 28 has a twist – after acknowledging that there are times when our pain is so deep we

can't find words to describe it, Paul BOLDLY asserts: "We know all things work together for good to those who love God and are called according to God's purposes."

HUH?!?!?!

How can our pain possibly be used for something good?! What good can come of this? Whenever I hear that question arise within me, I am reminded to look to the cross of Jesus. I believe the first disciples asked that very question when they saw him dead on the cross, "What good can come of this?" It seemed hopeless. It truly seemed all was lost.

BUT!!!!

It wasn't lost! Our God is a God of surprise endings! Even our pain can be transformed into something to beautiful, when we fully surrender our lives for God's use: when we love God enough to allow God to use us "according to God's purposes."

I am still packing boxes and cleaning the house that I lived in... I am sick of packing boxes. I have barely begun to unpack boxes. I wasn't ready to move. -BUT- I have been faithfully praying that God will use me – even if that means I need to move unexpectedly. And as the move approached and is unfolding I have been praying that God will use this time of upheaval to bring about beautiful transformational ministry.

I have been blessed to be assigned to serve at Memorial. I have been warmly welcomed and supported: allowing me extra time to try to get things settled with our house in San Jose, bringing food to the family, personally inviting me to join studies and groups, recognizing my son's birthday, offering words of encouragement and lifting me and my family in prayer. Thank you all so much!

To be sure: there are challenges. BUT – what is soooo BIG for us, is NOT so big for God! I am already seeing that God is bringing amazing blessing out of the pain and loss that has been occurring. I know that God is faithful: and God will bring greater blessing as the months unfold.

Let us, likewise, be faithful to God. Let us listen to the groans of the spirit, and also look to God for transformation. Our God IS an awesome God! Truly, GOD IS ABLE! -js
