CROP WALK – OCTOBER 24TH - Get out your walking shoes, Team Memorial. It's time for the Fresno/Clovis CROP Community Walk for Hunger. This year's Walk will begin and end at Temple Beth Israel, 6622 N. Maroa, on October 24th at 2:30 and walkers may choose to walk a Congregational 1.5 or a 3 mile route. Our church has been actively participating in this interfaith event for over 25 years and we hosted it last year. Walking with other faith communities and groups, our local walk raised nearly \$30,000 last year to assist global hunger agencies and our own Community Food Bank reach out to the hungry of our world and our valley. Each step we take on that day raises public awareness about the tragedy of hunger. ANNUAL CONFERENCE CORNER

FROM THE ANNUAL CONFERENCE: As United Methodists we are "connectional." This means that we are bound to all other United Methodists and work intentionally together to spread the Gospel message and build God's Holy Realm.

The primary way we relate to each other is through the Annual Conference. These two words used to describe an event to which the early Methodist circuit riders would travel each year. As the Methodist movement grew and expanded to become a denomination it become impractical for all the circuit riders to report to the same place for the annual meeting. Circuits were assigned to an Annual Conference. Over time, these words became used to describe a geographic region, more than a meeting.

In our time we distinguish between the geographic region and the yearly meeting by calling the former the Annual Conference and the later the Annual Conference Session (ACS). Each year all clergy with lay people from every congregation gather to conduct the business of our region, as well as to worship, inform and inspire each other.

This year Loraine May and Eddie Dyer attended the Annual Conference Session, along with Pastor Janette and Pastor Wang Pao. In the months to come you will be able to read in our monthly newsletter a little about what goes on at ACS, as reported by Loraine and Eddie. By sharing a little with you each month we hope that you will come to understand a great deal about this important yearly event: what happens and how that impacts our lives.

FROM THE PASTOR

The great commandment: Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind and strength.

These words are so important and challenge us daily. We are to love God with the fullness of who we are: mental, emotional, physical and spiritual beings.

BUT - many times we separate loving God with all that we are from loving God with all that we have. (Reread that sentence to make sure you got it!)

A story is told that long ago when the crusades were passing through the area we now call the Middle East, there were tribes that consented to be baptized, but as they were immersed in the water of their baptism they would hold up their left arm above the water- the one that holds the bow in battle. This symbolism is - they accepted Christ at many levels, but wanted to hold on to the old ways "just in case."

One of my professors in seminary joked that for many modern Christians, we become baptized, except for lifting our wallets above the waters. We are challenged to love God and Christ Jesus with all that we are, but stop short of loving God with all that we have, "just in case."

In the scriptures on Sunday we have heard many stories about stewards. For Christians, being a good steward is recognizing that ALL we are and ALL we have is a gift from God to be managed in such a way that it helps to spread the Gospel message and expand God's Holy Realm. Stewardship is a *lifestyle* of managing our <u>time, talent and treasure</u> to extend God's Holy Realm.

I encourage you to take time in the coming month to really look at your life - ALL that you are (not just your strengths and triumphs) and ALL that you have - yes ALL that you have. What are you willing to let God use? Are there things that are currently "off limits?" Lift in prayer and make confession to God any reluctance or withholding.

Remember, God loves you and wants for you health and wholeness. And God's power, working through us - ALL that we are and ALL that we have - can change the world!
