### ANNUAL CONFERENCE CORNER

#### WHAT HAPPENS AT ANNUAL CONFERENCE SESSION?

Each June pastors and lay people from throughout California and Nevada gather for an opportunity to worship together, to discuss current matters affecting the church, and to conduct the business of our region. Lorraine May and Edie Dyer would like to share with you from their experiences last June.

"Bishop Robert Schnase, speaking at the plenary sessions, put substantial meaning into the conference theme, Radiate, Initiate, and Co-create. He shared a great concern about the future of the Methodist denomination, citing the historical manner which John Wesley founded our church still has significant implications for today's lifestyle for individuals and in our communities. He focused his presentations on his book, Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations, which are, Radical Hospitality, Passionate Worship, Intentional Faith Development, Risk-Taking Mission and Service, and Extravagant Generosity. These practices describe the congregational activities through which God works to draw people into relationship. Followers of Christ aspire to grow in grace and in the knowledge and love of God. They do so by repeating, learning, and deepening their personal practice of generous hospitality, by placing themselves regularly under the influence of God's Spirit in worship, by intentionally seeking to grow in Christ-likeness through learning in community, and by practicing compassion and generosity in concrete ways. In these simple practices of Christian discipleship, the justifying and sanctifying grace of God becomes visible, real, and life changing."

#### FROM THE PASTOR

T IS TIME FOR A SPIRITUAL RETROFIT. I believe that this procedure needs to happen with some regularity. You may be wondering what I mean by the term "spiritual retrofit." Let me elaborate:

We live in earthquake country. We all know that we do not currently have the capability to predict when or where earthquakes will happen, or how strong they will be. When earthquakes happen, all structures are at risk of damage. In order to minimize potential damage in this state in the past 20 years we have spend billions of dollars retrofitting our buildings and highways, making sure structures have stable foundations and structural supports that can withstand severe earthquakes.

One congregation I served was in the middle of a building project when the bishop sent me there. The church property had a house on it that had been used as a preschool. A huge addition to the house was being built, expanding the preschool program and children's ministries. As part of that work, the existing building needed a retrofit.

To make sure the existing house would withstand an earthquake one couple in the congregation were working daily to ensure the entire structure was firmly connected to the foundation. They had removed flooring near the walls throughout the house. I can still see the man, in his late 70's, half inside the house and half under it with his wife of 50+ years following his progress foot by foot. Together they made sure that the house was bolted to the foundation throughout, then replaced the interior flooring and connected the new and old structures together.

I have always thought of their efforts as a metaphor for our spiritual life, too. We can't predict when our world will be rocked by all manner of hardships to outright calamity. To be able to move through these various challenges we need to be sure we are firmly connected to the foundation of our faith – Jesus. Before we move ahead, expanding our ministries, we need to take time to be sure that whatever bumps and jolts we may experience won't cause us to shift away from God.

One way to keep connected to and strengthen our bond with God is through practicing spiritual disciplines. Spiritual disciplines are "a means of grace" or a way to experience God. Often they accomplish this through small challenges that help us discover what impediments are inside us, prohibiting God from fully healing and transforming us into the people we have always wanted to be.

In the same way an athlete trains some everyday to grow in strength and endurance, spiritual disciplines provide regular opportunity for us to grow in our faith.

I am inviting the congregation to join me throughout 2011 in exploring 12 spiritual disciplines – one each month. I will publicize the disciplines through the newsletter, and talk about them in worship. For those who are inclined, I would be DELIGHTED to have weekly group time where we discuss our experiences and challenge ourselves to go deeper. Having a group to with which to share this journey can enhance the experience powerfully.

To help with this I will be using as a guide a book by Richard Foster, "Celebration of Discipline – the Path to Spiritual Growth." It is an excellent resource, and would be good to add to your personal library. You can find used copies online for under \$10 (which includes shipping). Older editions are fine.

In the stewardship letter you will be receiving the first week of November there will be a survey of how you would like to use your time and talents to extend God's holy realm. One item in that survey is making a commitment to engage in the spiritual disciplines throughout the coming year. I encourage you to prayerfully consider making this commitment. You will receive blessing "far more abundantly than all we can ask or imagine!" -js
